Is it possible to do good and make money? The answer is yes, over a long-term horizon. Investors now expect a competitive return for investing with a conscience. Evidence has also shown that investors undervalue socially responsible firms. This translates to the potential for purchasing investments at a bargain price.

Ethical investing is getting easier to do. Investors don't have to rely solely on companies to report their own socially responsible activities. Independent information like the Best Companies list and the American Customer Satisfaction Index provide information for investors who are willing to do their own research. Many large investment companies have specific funds identified as well.



Sustainable investing has come a long way and is providing some great opportunities to do good and to do well at the same time.
